ENVIRONMENTAL ACTIVITIES OUTSIDE THE CAMPUS

TOWN BEAUTIFICATION PROGRAMME

NSS WMO College conducted septage management survey in Kalpettamunicipality in collaboration with UNICEF. 52 groups of students including two volunteers have activelycoordinated survey using Google forms in two days.



SURVEY AND CHLORINATION AFTER FLOOD

NSS Volunteers of WMO College took part in survey of flood affected areas and losses at Panamaram Gramapanchayath and Pozhuthana Gramapanchayath. The volunteers vigorously involved in chlorinating the flooded wells, drinking water ponds and floors of houses. Around 60 NSS volunteers participated in the survey and the chlorination programme happened on 19th September 2018.

SWATCH BHARATH MISSION PROGRAMME

The NSS unit of our college visited Aduvady Tribal Colony, 11 th ward in Muttill Panchayath for a cleaning programme on 6th October 2018 under the guidance of our beloved principal Dr. Muhammed Fareed. Almost 100 NSS volunteers took the initiative of cleaning and removing garbage in the area. The NSS Programme officers Dr, Najmuddeen and Ms. Muhsina V divided the NSS Volunteers into several groups. Each group members were allocated with a particular area for cleaning. Few groups were asked to collect all the non-renewable wastes such as carry bags, plastic items etc. from the ground. We also conducted a health awareness camp to the colony people about the necessity of improve health conditions and personal hygiene.
