Meeting Minutes and Action Taken:

- The new anti-ragging committee was constituted based on the decision made during the staff meeting held on 01-06-2017.
- An orientation program was conducted at the department level for all second and third-year students.
- Anti-ragging awareness classes were conducted for second and third-year degree students.
- A committee was formed to monitor all activities on the campus.
- A team was formed to manage the notices for the anti-ragging cell.
- Awareness classes on anti-ragging were conducted for first-semester and postgraduate students.
- The monitoring committee promptly carried out its work.



- Some cases were registered among students, and appropriate actions such as suspension were taken. However, it should be noted that no gross disciplinary violations took place in these reported cases.

Action Taken

Fourteen students were suspended due to a conflict among students that required direct police intervention.

Academic Year 2017 - 2018

During the academic year 2017-2018, the Anti-Ragging Cell of WMO Arts and Science College, Muttill, played a crucial role in ensuring a safe and conducive environment for the students. The cell consisted of dedicated members including Dr. TP Muhammed Fareed, Dr. Yoosuf VK, Mr. Abin Kumar K, Mr. Siby Joseph, Mr. Hashim NK, Dr. Hemalatha C P, Mr. Shabeerali Pulikkalakath, Mrs. Suma. N, and Mr. Mahmood Aslam. Together, the team worked tirelessly to prevent and address incidents of ragging within the institution. A total of eight meetings were conducted throughout the academic year, during which various measures were discussed and implemented to tackle ragging effectively. The committee was initially constituted based on the decision made during the staff meeting held on 01-06-2017. It was determined that a proactive approach was necessary to combat this issue. To raise awareness among the students, an orientation program was organized at the department level for all second and third-year students. This program aimed to educate the students about the consequences of ragging and the college's zero-tolerance policy towards such activities. Additionally, anti-ragging awareness classes were conducted specifically for second and third-year degree students, emphasizing the importance of maintaining a respectful and inclusive campus environment.

In order to monitor activities on the campus, a dedicated committee was formed. This committee diligently oversaw the overall functioning of the institution and promptly addressed any reports or complaints related to ragging. Moreover, a separate team was established to manage the notices and communications for the anti-ragging cell, ensuring that all information was disseminated effectively. Recognizing the need to educate all students about the consequences of ragging, awareness classes were conducted for both



first-semester and postgraduate students. These sessions provided a comprehensive understanding of the detrimental effects of ragging on individuals and the importance of fostering a culture of respect and cooperation. Appropriate actions, such as suspension, were taken against the students involved. However, it is worth noting that these reported cases did not involve any gross disciplinary violations, indicating the effectiveness of the preventive measures and awareness campaigns carried out by the Anti-Ragging Cell.

In one particular incident that required immediate intervention, fourteen students were suspended due to a conflict among students, which necessitated the involvement of local law enforcement authorities. The Anti-Ragging Cell worked closely with the police to ensure that the situation was dealt with appropriately and swiftly, thus maintaining the safety and well-being of all students.

In conclusion, the Anti-Ragging Cell of WMO Arts and Science College, Muttill, demonstrated commendable dedication and proactiveness in curbing incidents of ragging during the academic year 2017-2018. Through their efforts, awareness programs were conducted, a monitoring committee was established, and appropriate actions were taken against reported cases. The cell's commitment to maintaining a ragging-free environment greatly contributed to fostering a harmonious and secure atmosphere within the institution.

- Due to the COVID-19 period, no cases of ragging were registered.

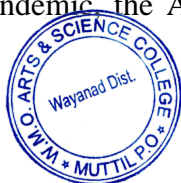


Report

The committee members, including Dr. TP Muhammed Fareed, Dr. Yoosuf V K, Mr. Abin Kumar K, Mr. Siby Joseph, Mr. Hashim NK, Dr. Hemalatha C P, Mr. Shabeerali Pulikkalakath, Mr. Aswin P, and Mr. Mahmood Aslam, adapted their strategies to ensure the well-being and discipline of students in the new learning environment. A total of eight meetings were conducted during the academic year, during which the committee members discussed the challenges posed by the COVID-19 pandemic and the impact of the lockdown on conducting online classes. The latest updates on COVID-19 and the prevailing lockdown restrictions in the region were reviewed to understand the context in which the college operated.

The committee addressed the challenges faced during online classes, including technical difficulties and internet connectivity problems that hindered smooth learning experiences. They also recognized the need for additional support mechanisms to assist students in adapting to the new mode of education. Meeting Minutes:
