Sue Young is an independent consultant/trainer in solution-focused practice after working most of her career as an educator in the United Kingdom. She began specialising in behaviour support to schools in the 1990s while having a particular interest in anti-bullying. Her work over the last 10 years has included introducing government initiatives for social and emotional development as well as giving support to individual children and parents. She uses solution-focused thinking to encourage success at every level in the school system. Her project on promoting friendship in schools featured in the UNESCO education newsletter and her support group approach to helping children feeling bullied in school has since been recognized throughout the world. She authored the book *Solution-Focused Schools, Anti-bullying and beyond* (2010) and a chapter "Solutions for bullying in primary schools" in De Jong & Berg, *Interviewing for Solutions* (3rd 2008).

for Physics and fostering a sense of curiosity and wonder for the world of science among the attendees.



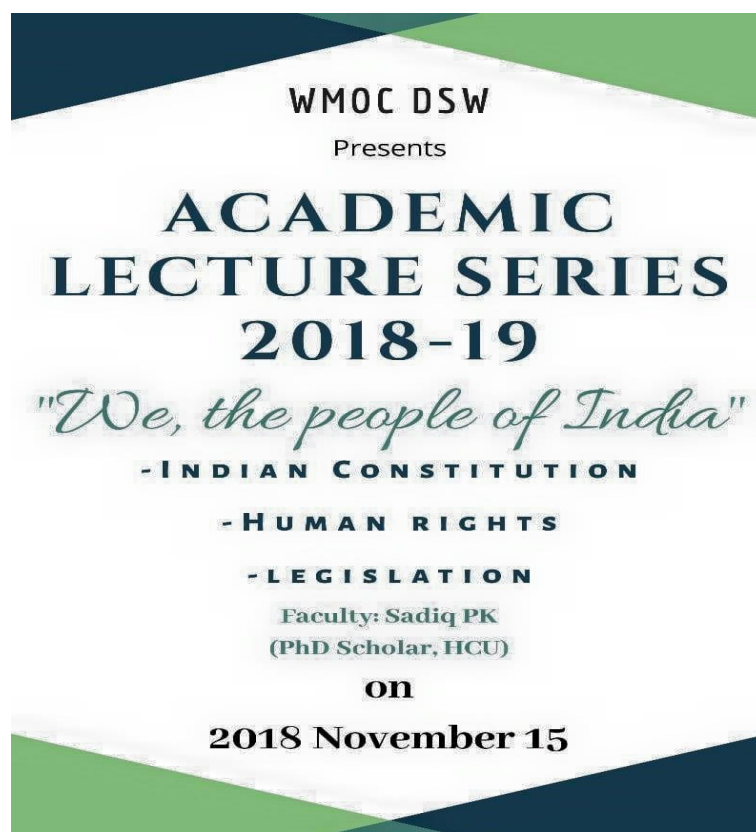
Orientation program on “Strategic Mantras For success In Life”

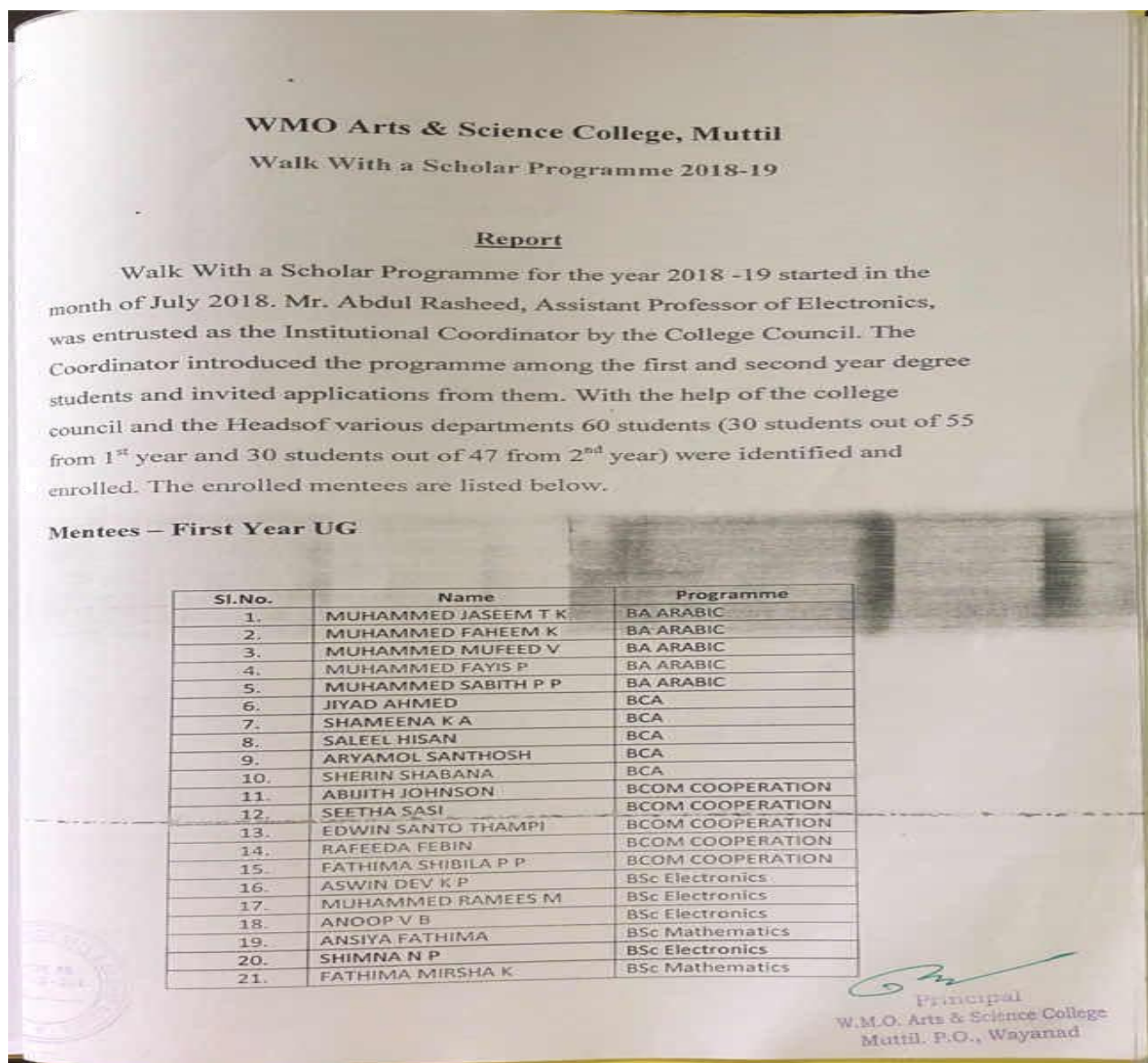





Bridge Course

All departments in WMO Arts and Science College Provided bridge courses to all first year students to help them to make a connection in their academics. Here is the report of the bridge course given by one of the departments.

CHEMISTRY

The Department of Chemistry, WMO Arts and Science College facilitated a bridge course for first-year undergraduate students. The title of the course was "Introduction to General Chemistry." The course was designed to familiarize students with the fundamental ideas and concepts that form the core of chemistry. It included three modules, each focusing on a different branch of chemistry - Physical Chemistry, Organic Chemistry, and Inorganic Chemistry. This approach ensured that students had a holistic understanding of the discipline before commencing their regular coursework.

Ms. Sonima V was appointed as the teacher-in-charge for this course. She is an experienced educator with a robust background in the subject matter and was instrumental in guiding the students through this initial phase of their undergraduate studies. The course ran for five days and saw active participation from 26 students. This strong attendance rate underscores the students' enthusiasm and willingness to understand the basics of chemistry before venturing into more specialized topics.

In the "Introduction to Physical Chemistry" module, the students were introduced to the principles and theories underlying physical phenomena and their relationship with chemical systems. The "Introduction to Organic Chemistry" module dealt with the structures, properties, composition, reactions, and synthesis of organic compounds. Lastly, the "Introduction to Inorganic Chemistry" module covered the study of properties and behaviors of inorganic compounds.

This bridge course was an essential part of students' transition from high school to undergraduate study, equipping them with the prerequisite knowledge to excel in their chemistry studies. It also served as an opportunity for students to familiarize themselves with the teaching methods employed by the Department of Chemistry
