showcased their dedication to creating informative and engaging content for their audience.



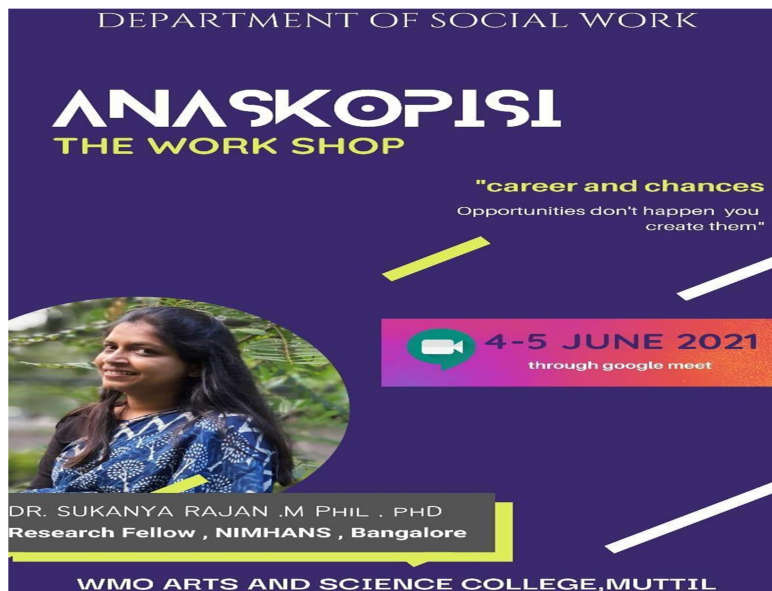
i TEACH- Teachers Workshop

contributing to the collective understanding of the intricate relationship between India and Arab literature.



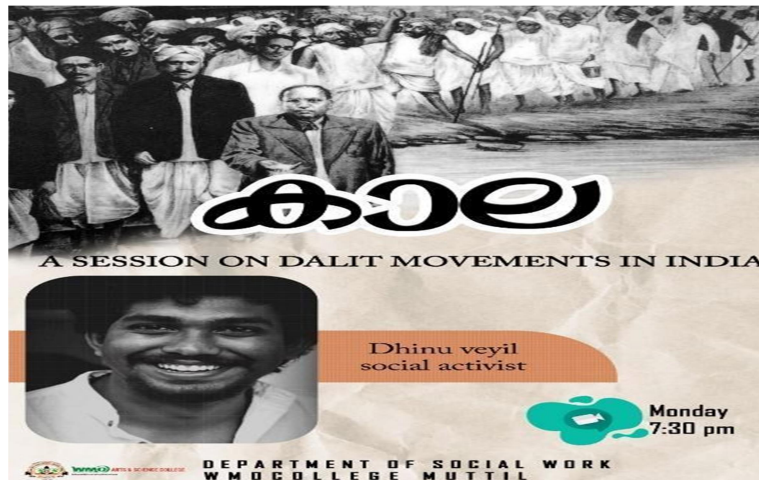
QURAN SEMINAR “vedhagranthangal: douthyamsandesham”

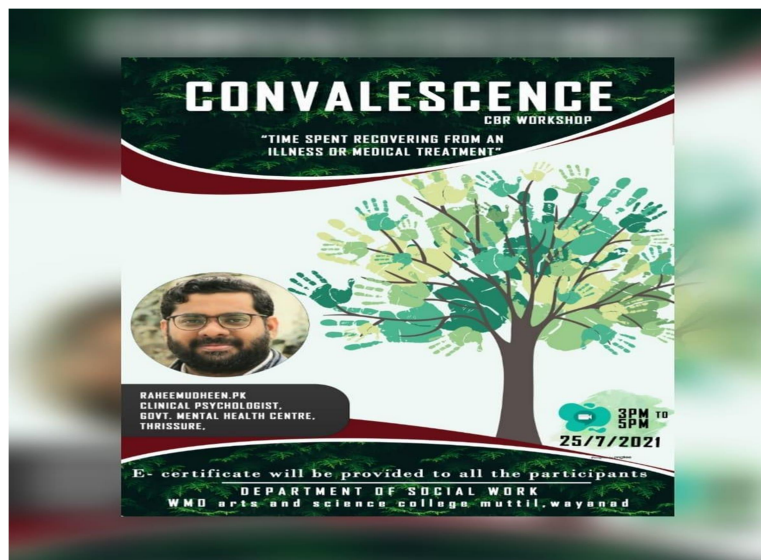

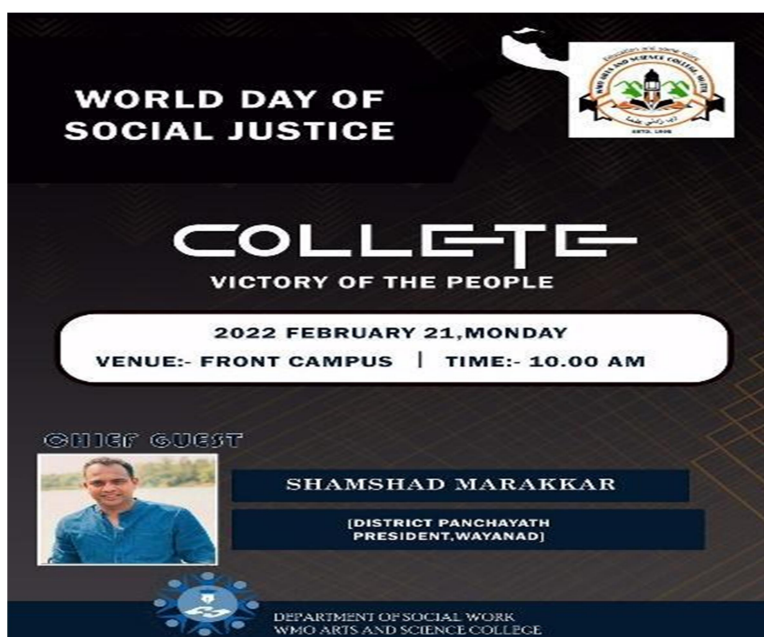
NO ONE CAN OWN ANYONE

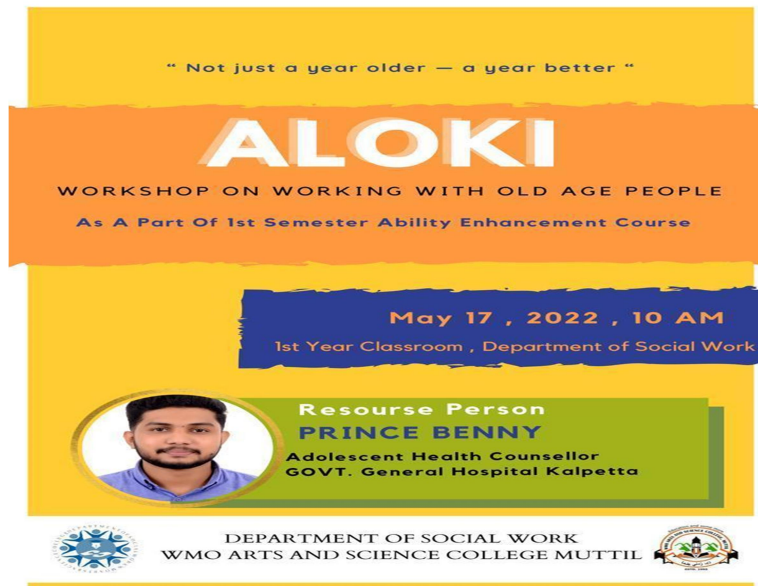
COLLETEE

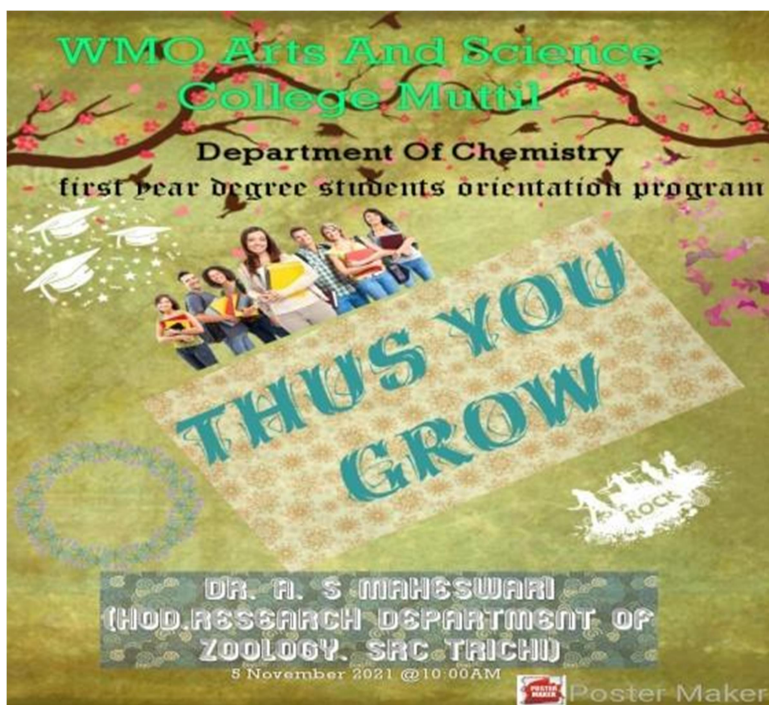
VALUE PROMOTION WEBINAR SERIES

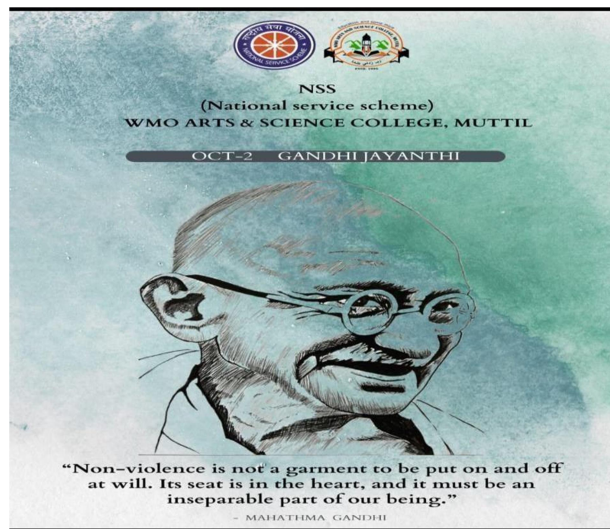
WORLD PALLIATIVE CARE DAY OBSERVATION

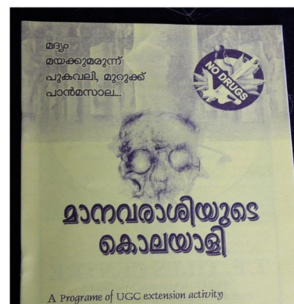
NATIONAL SEMINAR

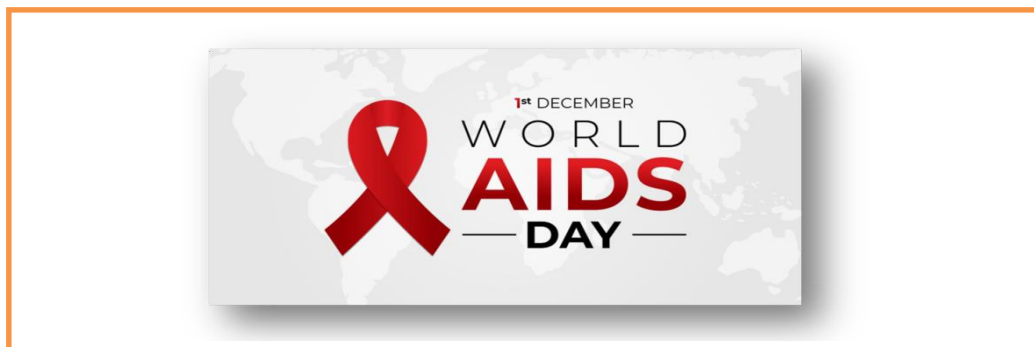
